

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board find that the design model of the Barnsdall Park Phase I Master Plan Implementation (#1026C) project is used and obsolete and should be disposed of; and,

That pursuant to Administrative Code Section 7.78, the Board find it appropriate to transfer said design model to Architecture and Design (A+D) Museum, subject to the concurrence of the City Purchasing Agent and adoption of a Resolution by the City Council.

SUMMARY:

On January 4, 1995, the Department entered into a design services contract with Peter Walker and Partner (PWP) for the design of the Barnsdall Park Phase I Master Plan Implementation (#1026C) project. The contract included a design model to be used for presentation in the design approval process. The project at this point is 60% in construction and has passed the design approval phase. The model has served its purpose. It is used and obsolete and should be disposed. With the limited storage space at both the relocated Planning and Construction Division and the Municipal Art Gallery at the site, neither the Department nor Cultural Affairs could not find space to house this large model (7-foot long by 3-foot high by 4-foot deep).

Architecture and Design (A+D) Museum, a California Non-Profit Corporation located in the downtown Bradbury Building, has expressed interest in of the Barnsdall Park design model which will be used, for various purposes, including exhibition. In as much as the design model would otherwise be disposed of and cannot be reused by the Department, and subject to the concurrence of the City Purchasing Agent and the City Council by resolution, staff recommends that the Board approve the transfer of the design model.
