SUBJECT: ECUADOR FESTIVAL 2004 FEES

Ecuador 2000 is a non-profit group requesting to hold their annual festival at Pershing Square on August 8, 2004, for the second year. The event will require the use of the entire facility for one full day (approximately 12 hours), and include community and commercial booths, staffing, security, maintenance and related costs. Fred Bolanos of Ecuador 2000 has requested that the permit fees be waived.

In 2003, the total fees for the event were \$9,435.62, of which Ecuador 2000 paid \$5,985.62; the Board waived the use of facility fees of \$3,450. At that time, Mr. Bolanos was informed of the No Fee Waiver Policy and that the decision to waive those fees was one time only.

At the May 19, 2004, Board of Commissioners meeting, Mr. Bolanos spoke during Public Comments and requested that his fees be waived again this year. The Commission requested more information from staff.

To date, Mr. Bolanos has not provided any justification for waiving his fees and has not differentiated this event from many private cultural festivals for which our parks are rented. The Department recommends that the fees not be waived. The Department receives many requests from non-profit organizations throughout the City to waive permit fees for various events. It would be unfair to other organizations to give Ecuador 2000 preferential treatment by reducing the permit fees. It would be a detriment to the facility to waive the permit fee, causing Pershing Square to reimburse the General Fund for this loss of revenue. Attached is the detail of the fees for this event.

SUBJECT: EXEMPTION UNDER CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT FOR PLAY AREA IMPROVEMENTS AT WESTCHESTER RECREATION CENTER

On June 16, 2004, your Board approved the Park Fees Project and Expenditure Program for Fiscal Years 1999-2003 (Board Report No. 04-216). This Program is a 5-year Plan which specifies 641 projects at 210 facilities. As the Board approved allocation of funding for all projects listed in the Program, it is necessary to submit CEQA clearances for individual projects.

One project listed in the Program is Play Area Improvements at Westchester Recreation Center. This is to notify your Board that staff has determined that the subject project is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to Article III, Section 1, Class 1 (12) of the City CEQA Guidelines.

The cost of this park improvement project is \$6,000. Sufficient funds are available at the Westchester Recreation Center Quimby No. 440 KWR sub-account to execute this project. Council District 11 and Department staff support this project expenditure.
