# **CALL TO ORDER**

## **APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES**

President Simril called for a motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of December 19, 2024. Vice President Sanchez made such motion, and it was seconded by Commissioner Hutton. There being no objections, the motion was unanimously approved by a vote of 4-0.

## **GENERAL MANAGER'S UPDATE**

Jimmy Kim, General Manager, began his update by introducing Kimberly Simonet, Principal Recreation Supervisor II of the Metro Region Recreation Division to introduce staff at the Chevy Chase Recreation Center and provide a brief update on the Metro Region. Mr. Kim also introduced Hector Vega, from Council District 13 to give welcome remarks.

Mr. Kim stated that RAP Commission Office has received various communications from constituents and those communications have been assigned to appropriate staff for follow up. Mr. Kim provided a quick update on childcare operations. RAP is currently shifting staff because we do have a staffing issue in terms of our part-time staff. But we have shifted some of our full-time staff over to some of the child care centers to make sure that those centers are fully operational and extending the time of operation for those that need it.

Mr. Kim mentioned the department had a very productive DEI training with our Senior Staff and he went on to thank our Chief Equity Officer Jennifer Perkins for organizing the training. Mr. Kim stated this department remains committed to diversity, equity, and inclusion throughout our organization. Mr. Kim also thanked Jasmine Dowlatshahi and Sonya Young-Jimenez for being integral in making sure that the community that were displaced have programming during the fires during the weeks after, as well as continuing the programming.

Gary Singer Superintendent of our Emergency Management and Citywide Aquatics provided an informational report regarding the 2025 wildfire impact and response and recovery efforts of the department. Sonya Young Jimenez Superintendent over the West Region provided us with a brief update on the Support camps that was opened during the fire.

Matthew Rudnick provided an update on the Rancho Park golf, clubhouse and restaurant Mr. Rudnick stated the concessionaire that we have a contract with communicated that they're unable to retain the financing needed to proceed with the project. We have some work ahead on that project, but want to give frequent updates to the board as well as the public on the effort. RAP Staff is currently working with our incumbent concessionaire on a settlement agreement to cooperatively terminate the current concessions contract, thereby reverting the control of the clubhouse and premises back to the Department
