About Our Program

Girls ages 15-17 are eligible to register for the Camp Hollywoodland Camper Leadership Development (CLD) Program. They learn many skills including how to lead activities, peer cooperation and how to become a successful camp counselor.

CLDs will have special training programs where they will learn more about being a camp counselor and work on developing the skills necessary to be an effective youth leader. Each week they will be focusing on a specific camper leadership skill set and will be given the opportunity to put the skills into practice. While the CLD Program does not guarantee a future camp counselor position at camp, it will improve the CLDs leadership skills and youth interaction skills which will make them a more qualified applicant.

As a CLD they will be required to assist in a variety of activities throughout camp. These include, but are not limited to, assisting during rest times in assigned cabins, assisting counselors during activities, entertaining campers, helping with set-up/clean-up of special events and assisting counselors for a part of trip day.

We must have IO CLDs enrolled per week to provide this program, so sign-up early!

How to Register

Please be sure to read, review, and understand all of our policies as outlined in this <u>entire</u> brochure before registering your daughter. Then, parents/guardians will be required to register online at https://www.laparks.org/camp/camp-hollywoodland and complete all required forms. All youth must be registered in advance to participate in our program. Onsite registration will not be accepted unless called off of the waiting list for attendance that day.

Completed applications are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. The rules of acceptance in the camp programs are the same for everyone, without regard to race, color, religion, or national origin. Persons with disabilities are welcome to participate in our programs. Reasonable accommodations will be made with prior arrangements.

<u>Queue-it</u>

In an attempt to make registration as equitable and easy as possible, we have implemented a "Virtual Queue" on the first day of our summer registration. Here's how it works:

Registration is <u>March 18th, 2025 at 11:00am</u>, online only.

On the day of registration, you can enter the online "waiting room" starting at 10:45 a.m. When registration officially begins at II a.m., everyone in the waiting room will be placed into the Virtual Queue in a random order to begin purchasing spots for Camp. A limited number of people will be allowed to register at once in order to keep the registration working smoothly, and more people will be let in from the queue every few minutes. The Virtual Queue will keep you up to date on your place in line.

Anyone logging on after registration begins at II am will be placed in the back of the Virtual Queue. Note: If you do not see a Virtual Queue it means that the maximum site visitors per minute has not been met, and therefore is not prompting.

Everyone who enters the waiting room between 10:45 am and II am will have an equal chance of being placed in the queue, so you don't need to worry about being the first person online.

Waiting List

If a camp session fills, a waiting list will be started in the order in which completed applications are received. Parents will be notified when a CLD space is available. Payment is not required at the time of application submission for the waiting list. CLDs do not request buddies as there is only one cabin.

Late Fees

If room is available after the deadline (2 weeks prior to the start of the session), we will accept registration with a \$50 late fee. Registration accepted one week prior to the start of the session will be charged a \$75 late fee.

Introducing ePact

To ensure the safety and well-being of all campers, we are now using ePACT, a secure online emergency network, to handle much of our camp paperwork. It must be updated quarterly, but can carry your information over to save you time.

What is ePACT?

ePACT is an online system that helps us collect and manage emergency information for your child. It allows us to quickly access important details such as medical conditions, emergency contacts, and consent forms, ensuring we have everything we need to keep your child safe. Registration and fees will continue to be on LAParks.org; ePACT notifications will be sent after you have registered.

Why ePACT?

- Convenience: Complete and update your child's emergency information online, anytime, anywhere.
- Security: Your data is stored securely and only accessible to authorized camp staff.
- Efficiency: Streamlines the registration process, reducing paperwork and ensuring we have accurate information.

How to Register:

- Invitation: You will receive an email invitation from ePACT to create an account.
- Create Account: Follow the link in the email to set up your ePACT account.
- Complete Forms: Fill out the required emergency information and consent forms for your child.
- Submit: Once completed, submit the forms through ePACT.

Confirmation Packet

A confirmation packet will be available to download one month before summer camp begins. No matter how many times you've been to camp, we encourage you read it thoroughly. It will include several pages of camp information covering <u>health procedures</u>, check-in and out procedures, rules of conduct, reasons for immediate dismissal, what to (and not to) bring to camp, spending money, mailing letters and other pertinent policies and procedures.

Cancellations

All cancellations must be made in writing (e-mail is accepted). Refunds take approximately 6-8 weeks. The registration fees will be refunded as follows:

I. Two or more weeks notice will be assessed a \$50 administrative fee, per session per camper.

2. Less than two weeks notice will be assessed a \$75 administrative fee, per session per camper.

Failure to cancel a session by the first day of camp at 8 a.m. will be considered a "No-Show" and NO REFUND will be issued.

<u>Changing Sessions</u>

Request for changes of session will be accommodated if space is available. Fees will be charged per camper based on the earliest effected session as follows:

I. With <u>2</u> weeks or more notice, \$50;

2. Less than <u>2</u> weeks notice, \$75.

No change of session will be allowed for "No-shows". No session change will be made until a written request and appropriate fees are received. These fees are in addition to the difference in session prices where applicable.

Cell Phones/Electronics Policies

Cell-phones, smart watches with cell-phone capabilities, and/or any other device that allows communication outside the realm of camp will not be allowed to be used while at camp. While we deeply empathize with deviceattachment, we find taking a break from devices for the week helps everyone better appreciate the present moment and to fully engage in program.

<u>Dropping Things Off /</u> <u>Showing Up At Camp</u>

No one is allowed to visit camp during a session (including parents, relatives, friends). Coming to camp to drop something off for your child, or sending someone to do so, creates a security risk and can lead to homesickness among campers. If you do decide to come to camp without prior notification or arrangement with staff, you will be asked to take your child home with you at that time.

A Word on the CLD Program

Our Camper Leadership Development program has been incredibly successful these past three years, and we are excited to see what this summer brings! This program, designed for teenagers ages 15-17 acts as a transition from their familiar camp experience through learning and practicing both hard and soft skills intended to help them thrive in the real world. During the week, the girls are asked to rise to the occasion of being role models to others. As CLDs, they participate in all sides of the camp experience-spending time playing with the younger campers, participating in all activities, learning the behind the scenes of setting up all aspects that make camp so magical, assisting both campers and counselors etc., while also developing and expanding their own unique sense of self. Focusing on self reliance, compassion, and sisterhood, the CLD program sets our teens up to be emotionally grounded, socially aware, and courageous role-models to all.

In addition to assisting younger campers, CLDs participate in weekly workshops tailored to the growth and development of today's teenage girls. Through these workshops the CLDs are building and creating a toolbox of skills and methods from which they can utilize in their everyday lives. The Camper Leadership Development program offers an opportunity for teenagers to take a step back from the stressors of everyday life and reconnect with themselves. It is a week full of unforgettable best-friendships, new experiences, and deep belly laughs. As a cell phone-free environment, the teens are allowed the freedom of going off grid and the escape from any social dramas from the outside world. The teenagers choose their "camp name" based on the man-made object of their choice and are able to embody their best selves. Through this program our teens can spend time in nature, feel important, step out of their comfort zones, help each other, and develop the best version of themselves as they see fit.

This is a program for teenagers who want to better themselves, to be of service to themselves and others, to try new things, to engage in self discovery, to be vulnerable and open, and those who want to engage and embrace their inner child. We work with the teens to strengthen their self-identity- from confidence to compassion to emotional regulation and self-resilience. It is a program that runs on participation, inclusivity, trust, acceptance, and love. With an open mind and heart, teenagers in the CLD program have the opportunity to make life long memories and profound relationships integral to their growth as people, friends, daughters, workers, et al.

Camp Staff

At Camp Hollywoodland, we believe that the camp experience shapes children's lives. Keeping this in mind, all of our staff are of college-age and chosen for their communication skills, experience or training in child development, the ability to be excellent role models and desire to create these outcomes.

Our rigorous selection process follows the ACA guidelines and includes multiple interviews, references and a background check. Our staff members undergo a minimum of one week intensive training and are certified in CPR and Standard First Aid prior to the start of camp. During the camping season, our staff is continually evaluated and guided to enhance their skills. The relationship between a camper and their counselor is at the heart of our camp's success.

Our CLDs work closely with many staff during their week at camp. They interact with a varied assortment of counselors as the CLDs assist during activities, visit younger cabins during rest hours, walk around with cabin groups for part of trip day, sit with campers at specific meal times, as well as during many other leadership opportunities. We're able to provide a wide range of personalities, professions, a passions, allowing CLDs to learn from a richly diverse community of role models.


