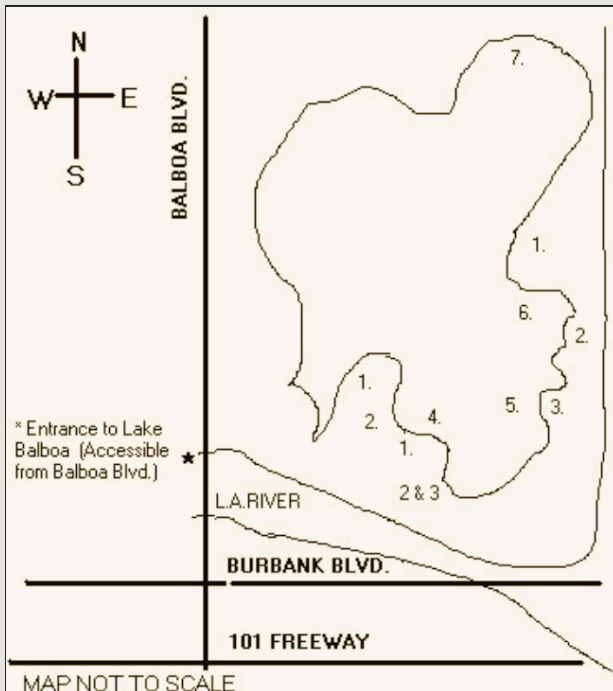


PARKING

Park Patrons must enter through the Balboa Blvd or Woodley Blvd entrances and park in designated parking slots. When using roadside parking, please park parallel to the road. The parking lot closes at sunset, after which vehicles are locked in.

WATER QUALITY

Swimming and other forms of water contact are prohibited. Lake Balboa is filled with water reclaimed from domestic use. The water is mechanically and chemically treated before release into the lake. The water makes its way through the lake before discharging into the Los Angeles River Channel.

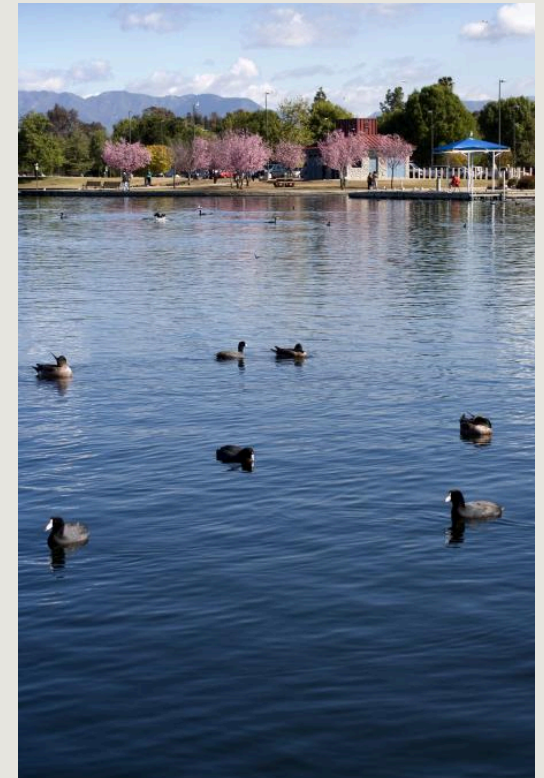

GENERAL INFORMATION

Park Hours: Sunrise to Sunset
Lifeguard Hours: 9:00 AM to Dusk
Fishing: During Park Hours
Boating: 9:00 AM to 1/2 hour Before Sunset

Anthony C. Beilenson Park is an 80 Acre water recreation facility within the Sepulveda Flood Control basin. The centerpiece of the park, Lake Balboa, is a 27 acre lake filled with water reclaimed from the Tillman Water Reclamation Plant.

The park is open from sunrise to sunset and is subject to closure during rainy weather. Recreation activities include fishing, boating, remote-control boating and jogging/walking. Access is from Balboa Blvd.



WALK/ JOG PATH

A 1.3 mile footpath surrounds the lake is restricted to foot traffic except for wheelchairs and baby strollers. A specially designated path for non-motorized, wheeled vehicles winds through the park. The path is connected to a series of bike paths throughout the Sepulveda Basin.

PRIVATE BOATING RESTRICTIONS

No motors allowed, except electric trolling motors (not to exceed 5 horsepower). Powerboats with outboards can be used on the lake with the following restrictions.

- Outboard motors in the up position
- Propeller removed
- Gas can removed

All boats must be a minimum of 7ft. 6in. length but may not exceed 18 feet in length. The speed limit is five miles per hour, including sailboats.

Inflatable kayaks/ boats must inflate from 3 separate chambers of the vessel.



REGISTRATION

All boats must have current registration with the State of California except:

- Boats propelled manually,
- Boats 8 feet or less in length propelled solely by sail
- Boats currently registered in another state and not remaining in California for more than 90 days.

All boats with electric motors including canoes must be registered and display a current registration sticker and CF number.

LAUNCHING

Launching of all boats must take place after 9:00am at the launch ramp.

INSPECTION

All vessels are subject to inspection by the lifeguards before launching. Lifeguards reserve the right to override manufacturer's specifications such as passenger capacity and may limit the number of people on board.

EQUIPMENT

Personal Floatation Devices (life jackets/cushions):

- For boats under 16ft, one US Coast Guard approved personal floatation device, (lifejacket), either Type I, II, or III is required for each person on board.
- For boats over 16 ft that are powered by sail or electric trolling motor, one US Coast Guard approved P.F.D., Type I, II, III is required for each person on board plus one Type IV.
- All PFD's must be in good condition, appropriate size for all people on board, and be readily accessible.
- No anchors allowed, due to an underwater aeration system.

FITNESS KAYAK PROGRAMS

Kayaks are available for qualified park patrons on a daily basis. Program participants must demonstrate kayaking techniques prior to purchasing a program rental lap pass. A scheduled kayak orientation class is available online or at the lifeguard station.
